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### General Comment

I am a strong supporter of the new policy (CMS-9992-IFC2) requiring health insurance plans to cover birth control without a co-pay. This is an important improvement to women's health care. Improving women's access to birth control is positive in so many ways. A woman who can plan when to have a family is able to participate in society more fully. Allowing women to space their pregnancies contributes to healthy childbearing. And ultimately, fewer unintended pregnancies can reduce the need for abortion.
