Qualifying Events

The severe storms occurred February 5-13, 2019, impacting nearly one third of the State. The storm's 5-8 inches of recordbreaking rainfall caused extreme flooding and embankment failures, along with extensive damage to critical roads and culvertsOhio received a major disaster declaration from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) on April 8, 2019, under Ohio Severe Storms, Flooding, and Landslides (DR-4424).

Proposal Summary

The Ohio Department of Job and Family Services submitted an application requesting \$8,828,533 in Disaster Recovery National Dislocated Worker Grant (DWG) funding. The purpose of the project is to create disaster-relief employment for eligible individuals to assist with cleanup and recovery activities in response to the recent severe storms and floods impacting southeast Ohio.
