This is to advise you of the disposition of your complaint filed with the Secretary of Labor alleging that violations of Title III of the Labor-Management Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959 (LMRDA), as made applicable to federal sector unions by the Civil Service Reform Act of 1978 (CSRA), 5 U.S.C. § 7120(d) and 29 C.F.R. §§ 458.26-28, occurred with respect to a trusteeship imposed by the Metal Trades Department over the Tidewater Virginia Federal Employees Metal Trades Council in Portsmouth, Virginia.

Pursuant to Sections 304 and 601 of the LMRDA, the Office of Labor-Management Standards conducted an investigation. After carefully reviewing the investigative findings, and after consulting with the Office of the Solicitor, Division for Civil Rights and Labor-Management, we have determined that legal action is not warranted in the trusteeship case. We are, therefore, closing our file as of this date.


