closing or layoff has occurred in the local area. Iowa has recently reviewed definition of the dislocated worker program to prevent further barriers to enrolling participants. Iowa has provided technical assistance to local areas on the importance of follow up contacts after exit. Iowa has provided a frequently asked questions resource to the local areas for quick reference.

During a recent monitoring overview training, local areas were provided with the steps needed to set up reports in our data management system to determine those participants who have exited

who are still needing follow up contact. Iowa has seen a jump in measurable skills gains after a recent technical assistance training was provided. Staff will continue to provide guidance

technical assistance to local areas to ensure data entry is accurate and complete.
