ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

Through data quality review before this report's submission, Rhode Island identified an issue in a local provider's youth records (understood to be approximately 12 records – Unique Individual Identifiers - 753932, 754934, 753856, 753928, 754974, 720467, 754970, 756072, 740166, 753892, 753917, 753915). The state corresponded with our management information system vendor for resolution who recommended action steps with the provider in direct possession of the necessary participant information. Due to the short window between notification of the above and required submission, the provider was unable to make these adjustments in a timely fashion in accordance with this deadline. The state will continue to work with the provider to remedy these records in the management information system.
