Overview

On June 10, 2021, the Department of Labor (DOL) awarded 68 YouthBuild grants totaling \$89 million to 31 states and Puerto Rico to help youth ages 16-24 who are neither enrolled in school nor participating in the labor market to obtain employment in construction and other in-demand industries. Individual grant awards range from \$700,000 to \$1.5 million each.

Administered by the department's <u>Employment and Training Administration</u>, YouthBuild grants support a pre-apprenticeship model to help these young people learn valuable occupational skills. They will split their time between workplace training and the classroom, where they earn their high school diploma or equivalency degree and prepare for postsecondary opportunities.

Organizations deliver training and employment in several in-demand industries, including construction, where youth put their classroom learning to use in building or rehabilitating affordable housing for low-income or homeless families in their neighborhoods. They also prepare for postsecondary training opportunities, including college, apprenticeships, and employment in other in-demand industries such as healthcare, information technology, manufacturing and logistics, culinary arts and hospitality. YouthBuild includes significant support systems, such as mentoring, follow-up education, employment and personal counseling services, and participation in community service and civic engagement.
