Early Lung Cancer Detection and Cure for Former DOE Workers

DOE and the Former Worker Programs are partnering to host a public webinar that will provide information about the early detection of lung cancer through screening with low-dose CT scans. When lung cancer is found early, treatment is more effective, and survival is greatly improved.

This topic is important because lung cancer remains the leading cause of cancer death in both men and women.

Presenter Biography:

Dr. Steven Markowitz is the Director of the Barry Commoner Center for Health and the Environment (BCCHE) at Queens College, City University of New York (CUNY). He specializes in occupational and environmental medicine. He has been the Principal Investigator and Project Director of the Worker Health Protection Program (WHPP) since 1998 and has directed the WHPP Early Lung Cancer Detection (ELCD) Program, the largest occupational lung cancer screening program in the country, since 2000.
